Have more opportunities to interact with friends of different strengths and interests

Have more options for post-secondary pathways, while ensuring they are prepared well for their chosen pathway

Use of Personal Learning Device (PLD) for Teaching and Learning



The National Digital Literacy Programme (NDLP)

1. The NDLP was launched in March 2020 to make digital learning inclusive by equipping students with the digital skills to be future-ready.

2. Under the NDLP, every secondary school student will **own a school-prescribed personal learning device (PLD)**. Students may use funds from their Edusave Account to pay for the PLD.





Supporting Students in the Safe and Effective Use of the Devices

The school has measures in place to enable a safer digital environment for learning with the use of PLDs. For example:

- Partnering parents/guardians to support students in their use of technology for learning
- Implementing classroom and PLD management and routines
- Educating students on Cyber Wellness
- Monitoring access and usage through Device Management Application (DMA)



Parents'/Guardians' Roles

As parents/guardians, you can help child/ward in the following ways:

- Model good digital habits for your child/ward and set ground rules for internet/device usage.
- Have conversations with your child/ward about <u>safe and</u> responsible use of technology.
- Encourage your child/ward to use <u>productivity tools</u> using his/her PLD, to organise information and simplify tasks for efficiency.



Device Management Application (DMA)

The DMA software is installed in students' PLDs to provide a safer digital learning environment, and to prevent misuse of the device.

- This applies to <u>both</u> devices purchased through the <u>school</u> and <u>student-owned devices</u>, to be used as a PLD.
- The DMA will be funded by MOE and will be <u>uninstalled</u> from the device when your child/ward <u>graduates/leaves</u> the school.





Funding Support for Singapore Citizen (SC) Students

- The cost of the device bundle can be paid using your child's/ward's Edusave account, after setting aside provision for payment of second-tier miscellaneous fees.
- To ensure the affordability of devices, MOE has provided <u>Edusave</u> top-ups of \$200 in 2020 to 2022, and \$300 in 2023, to all eligible Singaporean students in primary and secondary schools.
- This is on top of the annual \$290 credited into the Edusave account for Secondary School students and \$230 for Primary School students.



Funding Support for Singapore Citizen (SC) Students

• For SC students who are on MOE Financial Assistance Scheme or whose family's monthly income meets the following criteria:

Gross Household Income (GHI) ≤ \$3,000, or Per Capita Income (PCI) ≤ \$750

MOE will subsidise 50% of device bundle cost or \$350, whichever is lower.

• The remaining amount will be payable from the students' Edusave account. If there is insufficient balance in the students' Edusave account for the remaining amount, MOE will provide additional subsidy so that the **cash out-of-pocket** (OOP) is \$0.



Handphones



- Students are allowed to hold on to handphones in class but they should be <u>switched off / placed</u> <u>on silent mode and</u> <u>placed inside their bags</u> during curriculum hours.
- Handphones may be used only before curriculum hours, during recess or after curriculum hours.

Personal Learning Device (PLD)

Screens up:



3. A Self-Disciplined Newtowner is <u>well-groomed</u> and wears his/her school attire <u>with pride</u>.

- NO alteration of the school uniform e.g. tapered pants
- Students should be wearing white shoes and white socks.
- For jackets, students may wear jackets that are plain black, dark blue, white or grey (at most two combinations) in air-conditioned venues, during rainy weather or when unwell.
- Hair must be of natural colour.
- [Boys] Hair must be kept short, simple and neat.
 [Girls] Girls with long hair must tie up the hair neatly using a plain black/dark blue clip/hair tie. Fringes and tendrils must be pinned neatly.
- (Girls) Only one pair of simple ear-studs allowed.
- No other accessories/cosmetics should be worn.

Consequences for Attire & Grooming Offences

- Students not meeting required standards will be asked to make <u>immediate rectification</u> on the spot
- If that is not possible, students will be <u>sent home</u> for rectification
- Refusal to comply will result in referral to SM Committee and subsequent removal from class for <u>defiance</u>.




ZERO Tolerance to Bullying.

Bullying: **repeated** or **persistent** behaviours intended to cause hurt, distress or humiliation.



Creating a Caring & Enabling School Environment: ZERO Tolerance to Bullying



What can we do to create a caring and enabling school environment?

Do not let anyone feel left out, be a good friend.



Do not be a BYSTANDER, Be an UPSTANDER



Tell a teacher if you are being bullied or see someone else being bullied.



Serious Offences

Can affect eligibility in:

- representing the school for competitions or performances.
- participation in special programmes eg overseas trips
- selection for leadership positions or awards (including character-related awards)



Vaping





Vaping, like traditional cigarettes is **harmful** and can lead to **lifelong addiction**. E-cigarettes contain harmful substances such as nicotine, benzene and formaldehyde.

Sale, purchase, use, advertisement or possession of vape (including vape refills) is **prohibited** by law in Singapore, **regardless of age**.


Use of Social Media



Be mindful of the content posted on social media platforms.


Do not post, request or spread: any indecent, obscene, pornographic, defamatory material or message that is offensive, racist, vulgar, threatening in nature and capable of causing distress to others or tarnishing the school's image and reputation on social media platforms.

Any abuse of technology will result in serious consequences meted out by the school authorities or the police.

ABSENCE FROM CCA WITH VALID REASONS

- Absence from school on CCA day
 - Submit MC or parent's letter to Form Teacher immediately the next day.
- Absence from CCA with valid reasons
 - e.g. unwell or emergency family matters
 - ➤ Inform CCA teacher and go to General Office to request for Permission to Leave School.
 - Submit MC to <u>CCA Teacher</u> immediately the next day. Otherwise, <u>only two letters with valid reasons per semester</u> from parents/ guardians will be accepted.

CONSEQUENCES OF CCA TRUANCY

- Students who fail to attend CCA regularly
 - right subjected to disciplinary measures and conference with HOD or SH/PE & CCA and/or the School Leaders together with parents/guardian.
