Greetings from New Town Secondary School!

- 1 We hope your child/ward had a rejuvenating and joyful December break. - This New Year holds special significance as it marks the 60th anniversary of our school's founding. The theme for our 60th-anniversary celebrations, "Honouring Our Past, Forging Our Future", embodies our dedication to cherishing our rich history and accomplishments while embracing growth and progress for the years to come. To commemorate this milestone, we have planned a series of exciting events and activities throughout the year. We look forward to engaging the entire school community in these celebrations and will share more details as the year progresses.
- To help your child/ward settle into the new school term, there will be a three-day Orientation Programme for Secondary One students from 2 to 3, and 6 January and a two-day Start Right Programme for Secondary Two to Five students from 2 to 3 January. Please refer to **Annex A** for more details.

5 Students should report to school punctually by 7.35 a.m. daily for the Flag-Raising Ceremony (FRC). Students who are not physically present at the designated venue (parade ground, school hall or classrooms) for FRC by 7.35 a.m. will be considered late or absent.

Monday	 All students are to report in full school uniform (i.e. school polo T-shirt and school pants/ bermudas/shorts/skirt) with white shoes and socks. Classes with PE lesson on Mondays are to bring along their PE attire and change into their PE attire just before their PE lesson.

- Students are expected to bring a book or their Personal Learning Device (PLD) for morning silent reading after FRC. Secondary One students are expected to receive their PLDs before the end of Term One. The actual date will be shared with parents through PG in due time.
- 9 Secondary One students will receive a hardcopy timetable from their Form Teachers (FT) in the first week of school. Secondary Two to Five students may refer to the softcopy timetable via the school website at https://newtownsec.moe.edu.sg/.
- Home-Based Learning (HBL) aims to develop in your child/ward greater ownership and motivation in learning, as well as better self-management skills. HBL days will take place on selected **even week Wednesdays** in Terms 1 to 3. In Term 1, HBL will be carried out on 15 January, 12 February and 12 March. Your child/ward is expected to learn independently at home with prior instructions provided by his/her teachers. There will also be time allocated for Self-Initiated Learning (SIL) as part of the school's Aspire Programme. More information will be provided in Term 1.
- Your child/ward may be required to attend planned after-school activities on certain days. Attendance for these after-school activities is compulsory. Any absence must be supported by either a medical certificate (MC) or a letter stating the reason for absence by parents/guardians. Details on the After-school Academic Coaching will be provided in Term 1 Week 2.

School Attendance and Well-being

- We seek parents' support to keep our school a safe environment for all students. If your child/ward is unwell, please ensure he/she stays at home and seeks medical attention if necessary. If your child/ward is unable to attend school, an MC or letter¹ with valid reasons from parents/guardians is required. To ensure the safety of your child/ward, the SMS notification system will notify parents/guardians by 8.30 a.m. daily if your child/ward is absent from school.
- 13 If your child is recovering from respiratory-related illnesses, please encourage him/her to exercise social responsibility. (e.g. by wearing a mask, minimising social interactions with big groups) We appreciate your support and will continue to work with you closely. Let us all exercise personal and social responsibility and stay safe.
- To maximise the learning of your child/ward during the school terms, please refrain from taking your child/ward away from school during term time. Students should not take leave during the school term for personal and family overseas travel. Approval needs to be sought from the School Leaders prior to the booking of any overseas trips for leave request with valid reasons.
- Students who travel overseas during term time will be marked "Absent without valid reason" and their conduct grade will be capped at "Good". Furthermore, should there be a Weighted Assessment (WA) conducted during this absence, it will be documented as an Absent Status (equivalent to zero marks), which will be reflected in the result slip as 'AB'. We seek your partnership in ensuring your child has the best possible experience in school.

Revised Handphone Policy for 2025

Handphone usage is allowed only before FRC and after school dismissal, and only at the canteen and foyer areas. Handphones must be switched off and safe-kept in the students' lockers before FRC until school dismissal. Students must have their own locker lock and key. Handphones will be confiscated overnight if students were found using them anywhere during curriculum time. Parents / guardians will be informed of the confiscation via phone call / Parents Gateway and students will be allowed to retrieve their phones from the General Office the next school day after dismissal. For learning purposes in the classrooms, only personal learning devices are allowed. Students will be given sufficient time till **31 Jan 2025** to adjust to the revised handphone policy.

School-Based Assessment (SBA)

SBA will be carried out termly to monitor your child/ward's learning progress. Please see the table below for the SBA weightings by levels. The weightings apply to all subjects except coursework subjects². The relevant subject teachers will share the weightings with your child/ward separately. Your child/ward will be supported with regular assignments and feedback throughout the year to help him/her meet the required learning outcomes.

A valid MC must be produced by a student who has missed any scheduled weighted assessment, make-up WA or examinations. For digital MC, please share the URL with your child/ward's Form Teacher via email. A make-up Weighted Assessment (WA) will be conducted after school on the <u>first school day of the following week</u> for students who missed the original WA. Marks for make-up WA will be counted for students who provide a valid MC for the original WA.

¹ The school accepts two parent letters per semester. For submission of additional letters, parents/guardians will need to attend a conference with Key Personnel or School Leaders, and the student's conduct grade may be affected.

² These subjects include Design and Technology, Nutrition and Food Science, Art, and Computer Applications.

Co-Curricular Activities (CCA)

- 19 Every student will participate in a CCA in secondary school. CCAs will take place on the afternoons of Tuesdays and/or Fridays. Parents/guardians may refer to the school website for the CCA schedule.
- Secondary One students will be able to find out more about the CCAs offered through the CCA Open House on 11 January 2025, Saturday (refer to Annex A for more information). There will be a briefing on the CCA online selection during the CCA Open House. The CCA allocated to your child/ward will be made known on 31 January 2025, Friday. All Secondary One students <u>must</u> start attending their allocated CCA from 4 February 2025, Tuesday, onwards. Please advise your child/ward to check their respective CCA schedules of their CCA days and dismissal times.

Attendance and Temperature Taking Exercise (ATTEX)

- The ATTEx is conducted twice yearly (once per semester) and aims to maintain school's preparedness to re-activate the daily temperature checks should the need arise; and instill in students a sense of personal responsibility for their health and social responsibility.
- In Semester 1, the ATTEx will be conducted on 10 January 2025, Friday. All Secondary One students will be issued with a new digital thermometer in the first week of school. Secondary Two to Five students should bring a working digital thermometer to school and have it ready on the actual day of exercise.

School-Home Partnership

- A strong school-home partnership is essential to nurture the joy of learning and develop our students holistically. Parent Engagement Sessions will be conducted for all levels to provide opportunities for parents and teachers to meet up and strengthen this partnership.
