Guide for Saving Files from iPad PLD to a Thumbdrive

What to Prepare

Things You Need to Save Files on Your Thumbdrive

Before proceeding with factory reset of your PLDs, you will need to:

- Have one thumbdrive that is empty (recommend to be about 64 GB if you have many applications with files to be saved)
- Apple connector that can connect the thumbdrive to the iPad.

Explain Everything

 Launch the Explain Everything app. Select all projects/whiteboards. Tap Export (first icon on the top left). Save to Files Location> On my iPad > Backup_<date> > Explain Everything Backup.</date> If this is the first time, create a new folder and name it Explain Everything Backup. Wait for the files to be saved. 	 Open the Files app on your iPad. Go to On My iPad > Backup_<date> > Explain Everything Backup.</date> Select all the files you want to import. Tap the share icon. Copy to Explain Everything or Open in Explain Everything. Explain Everything will open and start importing the selected files. This may take some time depending on the number and size of the files.

2.	*A Handout will generate your padlet just as it sounds - with your posts on a paper. Slides will generate each slide on a page in PDF form. With Slides you can decide if you'd like the background included or excluded.			
3. 4.	Once the PDF loads in a new tab, click the download button in the upper right corner. The attachments of your exported PDF are fully functional, so you can click any attachment to load it in a new window.			
<u>Sav</u>	<u>ve as CSV</u>			
1.	This will download your padlet as a CSV file. You can use Numbers on a Mac or Microsoft Excel to open this file.			
<u>Sav</u>	ve as Excel spreadsheet			
1.	This will download your padlet as an XLSX spreadsheet file. This exported spreadsheet will contain as many as four detailed worksheets depending on the contents of your padlet: Posts, Comments, Reactions and Summary. Attachments on the padlet will be linked directly on the exported spreadsheet.

 Exporting the current canvas Tap Info Settings icon, then Save. Tap Export to Files .The browser lets you edit the name of the export. This name is only applied to the export and is not assigned to your piece in Sketchbook. If the file had been previously saved and given a name in the Sketchbook Gallery, that name will be applied in the 	 Import from Files Tap File icon, then select Import from Files Gallery. This will launch the iOS Files browser, where you can browse files on your device or on any cloud storage you have enabled on your device. Tap the file to import.
 dialog. Once you tap SAVE, the dialog will dismiss and you will return to Sketchbook. 	
Exporting multiple canvases from the Gallery	
1. In the Gallery, pinch-zoom out or tap to enter small thumbnail view.	
2. Tap Select in the lower left corner, and select the files you want to export.	
3. Tap menu and choose Share or Export to Files.	
4. Share will give you the option to choose TIFF or PNG.	
5. Export to Files will export TIFF.

 Launch Flipaclip. Click 3 dots on the top right. Select Make Movie. Select a format MP4 or PNG sequence. Select Save to Photos or Select More (check if there is an option for File Explorer so you can choose to select external storage) 	 Import from Files Tap File icon, then select Import from Files Gallery. This will launch the iOS Files browser, where you can browse files on your device or on any cloud storage you have enabled on your device. Tap the file to import.
