
Green Schools@South West Awards











Since its founding in 1965, New Town Secondary School has been steadfast in providing a holistic education for the students. Our school's goal in nurturing active and concerned students who contribute to sustainability efforts is evident through our participation in environmental education programmes. In the Green Schools @ South West programme, our Green Guardians represented the school as Junior Environmental Ambassadors in a one-day camp with specially designed activities that honed environmental stewardship and initiative. Our students championed ground-up green initiatives in school through school-wide assembly programmes. These programmes expose them to different environmental issues and rally them to take action towards environmental sustainability.

In recognition of our efforts, the school was awarded the Lotus Sustained Achievement Award in 2017 and the Vanda Miss Joaquim Award by the Singapore Environment Council (SEC) from 2019 to 2022. The school was also awarded the Gold Award under the South West CDC's Green Schools @ South West Programme from 2016 to 2021 and the Sustainable South West Award in 2021.

In preparation for the merger with Tanglin Secondary School in 2023, the Student Councillors (SCs) of both schools gathered on 22 June and 23 June 2022 for a time of cohesion and bonding.

The teachers-in-charge from both schools opened the session with a sharing of their hopes and aspirations for the new merged school. SCs engaged in games and teacherfacilitated discussions to get to know each other and to better understand everyone's concerns and hopes for the merged school. The SCs co-created a set of shared value for the new Student Council with the acronym UCARE: Unity, Care and Concern, Accountability, Respect, Empathy.

Applied Learning Programme

Started in 2016, our Applied Learning Programme (ALP) aims to develop critical and inventive thinkers through visual communication. Over the years, Newtowners have been exposed to techniques of viewing pictures from different perspectives and have the opportunity to explore various visual representations to bring across their intended message.

Tier 1 Programme

Our programme has evolved in response to the changes in our education landscape and the new technological tools available - from equipping students with photography skills using the camera to tapping on students' personal learning devices (PLD) to develop photography and animation skills. With greater accessibility to a wide range of applications, students can now tap on their PLDs to stretch their imagination, discuss ideas in class and apply their knowledge beyond the classroom.

Tier 2 Programme

Our Infocomm Technology Co-Curricular Activity (CCA) has been the anchor in providing opportunities for our students to broaden and deepen their learning. Through the CCA, our students acquire skills in product, street, event, nature and light photography.

They have also partnered the school's National Education Committee and Environmental Education Committee in organising school-wide competitions to provide students with opportunities to apply the skills taught in ALP.

Professional Development for ALP Teachers

To continually improve the quality of the programme, steps are also taken to develop the competencies of our staff. Over the years, we have equipped our ALP teachers with photography skills, digital illustration and photo manipulation.

To expand their pedagogical knowledge on designing blended learning experiences and to stay ahead of current trends, our teachers had the opportunity to learn from professionals in the Art and Design field through online courses.

Enhanced Art Programme











New Town Secondary School is one of nine secondary schools in Singapore to offer the Enhanced Art Programme (EAP). The programme seeks to develop resilient learners and confident leaders in the field of visual arts. This is achieved through laying a foundation that hones the confidence in students to discover and push artistic boundaries. Our EAP students are also given the opportunity to curate, exhibit and learn from creative professionals through masterclasses and combined programmes with other EAP schools.

Masterclasses

This year, we organised several masterclasses that tapped on the use of students' Personal Learning Devices and broadened their exposure to digital tools. These included a video production masterclass with our pathfinder and producer, Mr Melvyn Goh, as well as a digital illustration and photo manipulation masterclass with illustrator, Ms Stephanie Hew. These masterclasses expose our students to art tools, processes and creative expressions beyond what is taught in the school curriculum.

Combined EAP Schools Programmes

There are two major combined EAP schools programmes each year - the EAP Milestone Experience and the Incubation Lab Enhanced Art Programme (I-LEAP). This year's Milestone Experience was conducted online and our students had the opportunity to explore their areas of interest, as well as possible art and design-related careers in the creative arts industry.

Earth Day Commemoration

The theme for this year's Earth Day Commemoration was 'Invest in our Planet' and Newtowners commemorated this day through student-initiated learning.

The lower secondary students learnt about human activities that led to the pressing issue of waste management and were introduced to the concept of upcycling. They brainstormed and researched upcycling ideas independently before creating useful products from common household wastes. It was indeed heartening to see our students demonstrate creativity in turning waste into purposeful items.

The upper secondary students were given a 'Green Bingo' card which helped them choose their desired activities based on the environmental issues they were interested in. The activities included promoting awareness on saving energy and water, understanding the recycling

process, and sharing WhatsApp stickers to promote ecofriendly practices among family and friends.

Humanities Experiential Learning

Experiential learning is an important part of Humanities education as it connects knowledge taught in the classroom to the real-world context. Students learn Geography, History and Social Studies through inquiry, collaboration and hands-on activities.

In the learning of Geography, Virtual Reality technology facilitates place-based learning of issues such as water resource management, coastal management and tourism in Singapore. Out-of-school fieldwork opportunities, such as the coastal geographical investigations at East Coast Park further enhance students' learning of key concepts and processes.

The examination of authentic sources in lower secondary historical investigations brings alive interesting historical

events and figures. Students considered different viewpoints, analysed the validity of sources and developed a deeper awareness of past developments that shaped Singapore.

Secondary Three students completed a Social Studies issue-based investigation on the contemporary issue of diversity in Singapore. Students from 3E2 had the opportunity to collaborate with Nan Hua High School students on this project. Through the process of gathering and analysing data, and forming conclusions as a group, students develop effective collaboration and communication skills, and a deeper awareness of contemporary global and local issues.

The commemoration culminated with students designing a mascot for local farms with their pledge of commitment to support local produce.

On 6 April 2022, in line with the theme of "Singapore in Asia", the school commemorated International Friendship Day. Students reflected on Singapore's realities as a small state and how they could safeguard Singapore's national interest while contributing to regional and international cooperation. The programme also focussed on ASEAN's efforts to combat climate change as a community.

The NRIC ceremony held on 27 April 2022 for the Secondary Three students was an empowering citizenship experience to enable students to understand their rights and responsibilities as citizens. Student Councillors of each class facilitated the programme, along with active participation from their peers. The ceremony concluded with excitement as the respective Form Teachers presented the students with their NRICs.

Newtowners commemorated Racial Harmony Day on 20 July 2022. Students learnt about four lesser-known ethnic groups in Singapore: the Kristang, Orang Laut, Hakka and Malayalee. The school's Parents Support Group also set up a traditional games booth which attracted the participation of many students, some of whom were playing the games for the first time.

The National Day Observance Ceremony and Celebration was held on 3 August 2022. The theme for this year's National Day celebration was 'Stronger Together, Majulah'. This was a rallying call for Singaporeans to unite and forge ahead in spite of the difficulties and crises we faced as a nation. The celebrations featured inter-class competitions and showcased our students in action with representatives from the Uniformed Groups participating in the Observance Ceremony and CCA groups displaying their well wishes for Singapore. A group of students performed a medley of National Day songs to show the Singapore spirit. It was definitely a memorable celebration for all and marked the end of NE commemorative events for the year!

Learning from the Former Ford Factory exhibits

Using virtual reality to learn about Singapore's water resources

In Semester One, the Secondary Four and Five students attended a virtual National Education learning journey. Students participated in customised programmes by the Singapore Discovery Centre (SDC) and Changi Experience Studio (CES). Through the Virtual Escape Room conducted by SDC, students broadened their awareness of contemporary issues such as the evolving terrorism landscape around the world. The programme by CES highlighted the history and development of Changi Airport as well as its growth amid the challenges of global competition. Students gained a deeper appreciation of the areas of opportunities and challenges for Singapore.

The Secondary Three students attended a virtual learning journey with Singapore History Consultants. Through presentations and video walkthroughs of sites, they learnt about the historical challenges and constraints faced by Singapore, in particular, land and water resources. Genevieve Yap (3E4) shared, "I learnt about the importance of the government's planning and efficient space use for future projects. I can be an engaged citizen by providing feedback whenever possible."

The Secondary Two students visited the Former Ford Factory. The guided tours allowed them to gain an insight to the historical significance of the site and build strong connections to what they learnt in their History curriculum.

As part of their Geographical Investigations, the Secondary One students embarked on a virtual learning journey to Jurong Lake Gardens using Virtual Reality technology. Through active observations, group discussions and action-planning, students learnt about the importance of Singapore's water resources and how they could conserve the resources.

Creating a Caring and Enabling School Environment

Character and Citizenship Education (CCE), including National Education and Social Emotional Learning, are integral to the holistic development of Newtowners. Through CCE lessons and other student development experiences, our students learn core values, social-emotional competencies and citizenship dispositions. During CCE lessons, students spend time discussing issues like mental health, cyber wellness and family education. They also do their part for the community through Values In Action projects. Students get the opportunity to attend talks by invited speakers from the Institutes of Higher Learning as part of their Education and Career Guidance exploration.

Teachers use the Form Teacher Period to build rapport with their students and enable students to strengthen their bonds with their classmates. This is done through various teacher and student-led activities as well as personal reflections. On every class noticeboard, a Gratitude Challenge segment is set aside for classes to be reminded of the importance of showing gratitude to those around them.





Water Filtration Activity

Our Secondary One students engaged in an interesting activity during their Science lessons in Semester One. As part of their Blended Learning Experience, students learned the concept of separation and filtration with online lesson packages and a hands-on experience in filtering pond water using a variety of materials.

Through inquiry and collaborative learning, students experimented with different methods of filtration. After each try, students analysed and improved on their water filter design to enhance the quality of the water. This integrated activity allowed our students to innovate and inquire through research and questioning.




Investigative process for water filtration


